1. Please describe your arts education and/or arts background.

**I have a BS: Media Arts and Animation from the Art Institute of CA-Los Angeles, and a MFA: Animation and Visual Effects-Visual Development from the Academy of Art University in San Francisco. My specialty is Visual Development (illustration for film). I have been a free-lance artist for over seven years and currently own my own freelance business in Juneau.**

2. ART FORM(s) which you are interested in teaching (list all, with preferences starred) and age of students you are interested in working with.

*(EX: Music and Rhythm. Part dance, part counting, part singing, I use music to help children learn about mathematical patterns and music. In this I address Alaska State Standards Art A and Math A)*

*(EX: I am a singer/musician. I have lesson plans that relate to math and counting for elementary age students, world folk songs that would augment World History or Geography for middle schoolers and can work with high school students to develop small jazz ensembles)*

**I am an illustrator, animator, and graphic designer. I can teach anatomy for high-school from life-drawing with models as well as do landscape work on-site. In traditional mediums, I draw and paint in water and oil base. Digitally, I am proficient in the Adobe Suite, including Photoshop, Illustrator, AfterEffects, and Flash. I also have expansive knowledge of art-history through the ages as it pertains to philosophy, psychology, anthropology, and sociology for high-school. For all ages, I can teach color theory, hue, value, shape, and contrast concepts when developing an idea such as characters within an imagined environment; these can be valuable tools to express storytelling in any level of language arts. I can also teach any form of animation for all ages: traditional and digital 2D, 3D (3D Max and Maya), stop-motion, and claymation. With animation, the students learn about modeling with either clay or in 3D, depending on the medium being animated. With graphic design, I teach about different styles of typography and their appropriate uses in both hand-lettering and digital altering.**

3. What themes, concepts, and experiences do you want to share with students?

**Art is a form of communication. I want to teach the students how to most effectively express themselves through the art they produce while discovering their voice. There's a right and left side of the brain that needs to be exercised in all topics. It's important to always implement our creative sides when trying to understand any subject and I want to teach ways that this is possible. For example, in illustration I can do**

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**this through various drawing exercises in finding the most effective way to get one's point across in color, value, shape, and composition to lead up to a final piece(s) that the student will feel confident with.**

**May 2010: *The Canvas*, Juneau. Taught the process of illustration to 8-13 year-olds from *Goldilocks and the Three Bears*.**

**September 2005-Dec 2008: *Faith Christian Fellowship*, Walnut Creek, CA. Taught 5-12 year-olds Sunday school and *GEMS* (an after school girls Bible school) once a week.**

**2001-2002: *University Christian Church-Culver City, CA*. Taught middle-school Sunday school and assisted high-school youth group.**

**I want to help students hone their creative voice in ways of expression and passion that will be partnered with technical advancement. To be an artist is a great responsibility in shaping culture. I want to teach how we use art in both preserving and developing our society.**
